

HIGHWAY ROBBERY.—Goes A. Kimmel of Altoona was knocked out of his seat at a hotel in Somersett on Saturday evening, while beyond the limits of this hotel, while on his way home, and robbed of his pocket book containing one hundred and ten dollars in money, besides a number of valuable papers. Mr. Kimmel was severely wounded and unconscious when he was taken from his pocket and carried it before at least a half dozen different people. A colored man who had been living with Dr. E. Kimmel is strongly suspected of the perpetration of the deed and is now in jail.
