THE MIDDLE PENITENTIARY.—A meeting of the Penitentiary Board was held at Huntington last week, and the members report that the partial appropriation made by last Legislature is almost exhausted in paying the bills for the Penitentiary. The board has not determined yet whether the institution shall be conducted on the reformatory plan or not. The act of Legislature specifies that it shall be modeled after the Eastern Penitentiary, in an absolute sense. It is a military confinement and performs their hard labor in their cells. Several members of the Board favor the reformatory system; however, the old plan is very popular in the East and it may finally be adopted. When the Board meets again, it will discuss the plan at length. It will be regarded by many as the most important institution of the age.
