OUR WASHINGTON LETTER.

(FROM OUR SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT.)

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20th, 1880.

The Democrats here are not so boisterous and enthusiastic about Hancock's prospects as they were a few days ago.

The Queen of Spain has been delivered of a daughter. The Princess was born about nine o'clock Saturday night. According to ancient etiquette the ministers, marshals, grandees, and courtiers, in the ante-chamber, the Duke of Sexto
