AMENDMENT.

ARTICLE XIX.

The manufacture, sale, or keeping for sale of intexticating liquor, to be used as a beverage, is bereby prohibited and any violation of this prohibition shall be a mostemeanor, punishable as shall be provided by law.

The manufacture, sale or keeping for sale of intextesting liquor for other purposes than as a beverage may be allowed in such manner only as may be investiged by law. The General Assembly shall, at the first session secreding the adoption of this article of the Constitution, enact laws with adequate penalties to its enforcement.


