IN presenting this report for the year 1908, we are glad to be able to report that the year has been a successful one for the House of Employment, and that the inmates have been well cared for, and that the work has been well done.

THE many visits made to the Home by prominent citizens, the reports of the Grand Jury, show what pride the people have in the work which we are doing, and what sympathy they manifest for the poor and unfortunate in life.

THE Farm is in a better state of cultivation than was ever known. Reference to the report of the Steward will fully confirm the assurance. At present it presents a fine appearance. The buildings are in good repair, and the work is well done.

THE stock on the farm is in good order, the cows furnishing all the milk, cream and butter used at the Home; besides, for part several years, they have sold a number of calves, which have been well cared for, and are now being sold at a profit.

THE children and outdoor families, and indigent have all good homes and are well treated, only one complaint having been made, which was immediately looked after, and the child recovered, and the child is settled in the home of the unfortunate and certain extent, good treatment.

THE applications for relief are more frequent each year, and it is perhaps one of the most important questions which we have to deal with, and which we are doing our best to solve.

THE inmates at the Home have all the comforts they could desire, without being extravagant. There have been but few complaints, and many expressions of praise for the comfort and kind treatment granted them, which is evidence from the fact that two of the inmates, since their admission to the Poor House, received a pension from Government, but who still desire to stay.

THE Steward and Matron are uniting in their efforts to make all comfortable, and relieving the suffering and distressed. Too much praise cannot be given them for the interest they have shown, and the care they have taken, in the welfare of the Poor House.

THE deaths were eleven deaths at the Home during the year, all of whom lived out their allotted time, and the management of the Home was well conducted, and the work was well done.
