

"How'll Oi be injured ?" growled Mike, straining at the windlass, the sweat pour ing off him.







C., May 29 .- The bill abjecting interstate commerce liquous to the laws of the several States was discussed in the Senate to-day, and, after a brief conideration, that body adopted a substitute y Senator Gray providing that all ferment cine. ed and distilled or other intex cating liquor or liquids transported into any State or Ter-Hory for use, consumption, sale or storage all, on arrival in such State or Territory or remaining therein], be subject to the opration and effect of the laws of such State or Territory, enacted in the exercise of the police powers, to the same extent and in the same manner as though such liquors or liquids had been produced in such State of from by reason of being introduced therein






