Judge Stalford the owner, was a good farmer, and during his lifetime, or as five for \$1. Soid long as he farmed it himself, the land was as well tilled and as well taken care of, as land can be without the application of manure. After taking off a cropof whent, the field was usually seeded with clover, which was sometimes mowed, but esually pastured, and the land was allowed a reasonable time for rest and recuperation before it was again disturbed by the plow. Long before the judge's death, in about twenty-live years after the field was cleared, I noticed that it was difficult to obtain a good stand of elover. There would be many spots on which there ald not appear to be any clover, and when there was a catch there was by no means a vigorous growth. The land was getting "tored" and "sick." The clover told the story in the most positive language, and hung out the signal of distress to the view of every observer. That the soil was naturally good and strong, it had given abundant proof. It was not heavy hand that favors the frust in heaving the clover roots out of the ground and leaving them bare. Its sheltered situation was favorable for clover as well as wheat; but the clover could no longer find the fatness it feeds on even by searching with its deep roots in every particle of the sub-soil.

When the judge's health failed, the field was rented at 36 per acre, and the renter summer-followed it by plowing three times, doing his work well, sowing in good serson, and obtained a good cropof wheat. He followed the wheat with rye, and had but a moderate yield. He tried corn and the corn was very poor. He sowed it with outs, and they were hardly tall enough to bind. It was again seeded to clover, but it only grew in spots and these were feeble and sickly. On half the field there was nothing to speak of-neither clover, grass nor weeds. The best spots were cut with the machine. the remainder mowed around and left because it was not worth mowing. It was tried again with wheat last year, and the crop was scarcely worth harvesting. The wheat was followed with rye, and the rye this year was of stunted growth, slender straw and short heads. A good crop of rye next year is hardly to be expected, and j siging from the past, a good catch of clover, without the application

of some fertilizer, is utterly impossible. Waldo F. Brown has stated that there are fields in his vicinity in Botler county, Ohio, which have been tilled for 40 years without the application of any fertilizer, whatever, and have been kept up to the full standard of their original fertility merely by the use of clover and a judicious rotation of crops. The statement proves that those fields were very rich and that it takes longer to exhaust them. The deepest and strongest wells can be pumped dry. Clover gathers up the fertility in the soil and makes it available. Its long roots penetrate deep into the subsoil and bring back the fertility that has escaped beyond the reach of most other plants; but clover root cannot reach the sewers of London or Liverpool and bring back the life-blood of the soil that has been shipped away in the wheat, corn, butter, cheese, pork, beef and lard that have been exported .- Country Gratleman,




