Over one hundred different committees had him in hand at differen times. The usual course was to lynch him after supper and then retire, the intention being to take him down in the morning. Ruggies would help himself down shortly after midnight, secure a few good horses and pass to another community. A handsome full beard always concealed the silver tube and his secret was never discovered by the committees. On one occasion the Willing Workers' vigilance committee, of Saints' Rest, N. M., kept him suspended two days, but, though he suffered somewhat from hunger, that was all. 


