SAMUEL BUTLER, who was at one time Treasurer of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, died at his home in West Chester, Sunday.

YOUNG KANSAS homesteaders having proved up their claims are now waiting back East for wives. That's a sort of farmers' alliance the women will have no objection to.

The State Legislature has appointed a committee to thoroughly investigate the horrible mine disaster in Westmoreland county whereby one hundred and ten lives were lost.

The new United States Senator from Kansas, who knocked Senator Ingalls out so handsomely, has always been a Republican, but how he will vote when he gets into the Senate time alone will tell.

One of the most interesting facts in the condition of our country to-day is that business prosperity which has continued for more than a decade, still continues. There are individual exceptions, but genuine prosperity gladdens the hearts and the homes of the masses.

The Philadelphia Press has discovered that Governor Pattison's inaugural address delivered this year is in a great part word for word the one delivered eight years ago. To prove it, the paper prints the two side by side. The question now arises, who wrote the first one?

The friends of Governor Hill say he is using every effort to prevent an extra session of Congress. It would interfere with his plans. If the President desires to punish the people and make Jordan a hard road to travel for Democracy in 1892 he will call an extra session of Congress.

The members of the Blair county bar, irrespective of party, have signed a petition asking Judge Dean to be a candidate for re-election to the office of President Judge of that county. It is likely that the Judge will grant the prayer of the petition and will be elected for another ten year's term.

The State Legislature passed a resolution Thursday calling upon the U. S. Senators from Pennsylvania to support by all fair and honorable means the bill for all rights to secure free and unhindered elections in every State in the Union. Governor Pattison returned the resolution to the Senate with his veto Monday. Copies of the resolutions as it passed the Senate, however, were forwarded to Senators Cameron and Quay.

Speaking of the action of small politicians and their threats regarding the World's Fair, the Hartford Conn. says: "Such an attitude toward Congress and the National Government is little short of an insult. Start the fair and you couldn't keep these same people from it, election law or no election law. They will be there if you can afford it, and more surely if you can't afford it. The talk is cheap and silly."

A bill has been presented in the Kansas Legislature giving the right to vote and to hold office to all women of legal age. The women of Kansas have enjoyed for several years the right to vote in municipal and school elections and to hold office. It will be indeed a boon to the women of Kansas if they are not sleepy. They will do up to the necessary legislation and get home in time for the spring crop. Other States might learn a lesson from Kansas.

Interpretation seems to be the Southerners' favorite method. They used it unnecessarily to keep Republican voters from the polls, and when a measure was proposed that had to be put a stop to this they undervalued to secure its defeat by their old tactics of intimidation. But threats will not hurt the World's Fair. The South can not afford to be unprepared, and the bluff will only incite the North to greater interest in the fair's behalf.

The following interview with Congressman Scull appeared in the Philadelphia Press last Tuesday morning:

Representative Scull said: "I think that Mr. Cameron in his vote to-day did not represent the opinion of the Republicans of Pennsylvania. I think that the Pennsylvania Republican Representatives when they unanimously rejected the bill in the House, did represent the opinion of the Republican Pennsylvania. Mr. Cameron's vote to-day was a surprise to me. I labored earnestly for his re-election and was instrumental in securing for him three votes in the Legislature from my county of Somerset, believing that he would favor the bill which carried out the declaration of the Republican National and State conventions. I am exceedingly annoyed at the result. It was a life long friend of General Cameron, but I cannot approve the action of his son in this matter."

Mr. Scull advises that the Press misquotes him, inasmuch as he said: "I was partly instrumental in securing for him three votes."

As one of the constituents of our representatives at Harrisburg he had a right, in common with all other Republicans of the county, to advise or advocate the election of Mr. Cameron, believing him to be a sound Republican and useful Senator.

The Constitution of the State, in section 18, sets forth that "The General Assembly, immediately after each United States decennial election, shall apportion the State into Senatorial and Representative districts, agreeably to the provisions of sections 16 and 17." Section 16 reads as follows: "The State shall be divided into fifty Senatorial districts, of compact and contiguous territory, as nearly equal in population as may be, and each district shall be entitled to one Senator. Each county containing one or more rates of population shall be entitled to one or more Senators for each rate, and an additional Senator for an surplus of population exceeding three-fifths of a rate, but no county shall have a separate district unless it shall contain four-fifths of a rate, except where the adjoining counties are each entitled to one or more Senators, when such county may be assigned a Senator in excess of its four-fifths and exceeding one-half a rate; and no county shall be divided unless entitled to two or more Senators. No city or county shall be entitled to separate representation exceeding one-sixth the whole number of Senators. No ward, borough or township shall be divided in the formation of a district. The Senatorial ratio shall be ascertained by dividing

the whole population of the State by the number fifty."

The population of the State as officially ascertained is 2,828,014. By applying the ratio of the Constitution and dividing this sum by fifty, the Senatorial ratio is found to be 56,560.

Section 17 of the Constitution declares, "The members of the House of Representatives shall be apportioned among the several counties, on a ratio obtained by dividing the population of the State, as ascertained by the most recent United States census, by two hundred. Every county containing less than five times the ratio shall have one Representative for every full ratio, and an additional Representative when the surplus exceeds half a ratio; but each county shall have at least one Representative. Every city containing a population equal to a ratio shall elect separately its proportion of Representatives allotted to the county in which it is located. Every city entitled to more than four Representatives, and every county having over one hundred thousand inhabitants, shall be divided into districts of compact and contiguous territory, each district to elect its proportion of Representatives according to its population, but no district shall elect more than four Representatives."

By applying the ratio set forth in this section of the Constitution it is found that the ratio for a Representative is 20,250.

The population of Somerset county being 27,317, she loses one member, as does Bedford, while Blair and Cambria counties will have three members each in the House of 1893.
