Experiment Station

The first agricultural experiment station in this country was established by Connecticut in 1875. The example was soon followed elsewhere. The appropriation by congress of \$15,000 per annuon to each of the states and territorie which have established agricultural colleges or agricultural departments of colleges has led to the establishment of new stations or the increased development of stations previously established under state authority, until there are now agricultural experiment stations in operation in all the states and territories except Montana and Idaho.
