THE GREASY SCULL CONTEST. The Elections Committee Submit a Unanimous Report. THE MAJORITY FOR MR. SCULL INCREASED OVER THAT RETURNED FOR HIM—THE CONTESTANT HAD NO CASE—THE ELECTIONS COMMITTEE OF SOMERSET AND ELK LIKED TOWNSHIP OFFICERS AND SIX TOWNSHIP CLERKS REPORTED COUNTY DISFRANCHISED—THE COMMITTEE HOLD THAT RESIDENTS IN TOWNSHIPS CANNOT LEGALLY VOTE IN BOROUGH.

Mr. O'Connell, chairman of the Horse Elections Committee, has submitted the unanimous report of the committee, which will be voted on within the next few days, in the Greasy Scull contest. The committee report that "Thomas H. Greasy was not elected representative in the fifty-second Congress from the Twentieth Congressional District of Pennsylvania, and is not entitled to a seat there," and that "Edward Scull was duly elected a representative in the fifty-second Congress from the Twentieth Congressional District of Pennsylvania, and is entitled to retain the seat he now holds."
