"I was incredulous concerning the measurements made, but I was in the belief that these remains were those of a race not very different from the so-called Village Indians of the southwest in point of stature. "The race affinities of the so-called pygmies are very doubtful. Several writers upon the question find close resemblances between their habits and those of the Pygmies of Africa. In many ways I know that they closely resembled or perhaps were identical with the Asteans and some of the semi-civilized nations of ancient Mexico and Central America.

In the pits and the mounds the pygmies were somewhat behind the Asteans, for their pottery is rough and without glazing, while that of the Asteans was in many cases finely enamelled. In their ornamental decorations, too, they were behind, having made only simple designs, while the Asteans used a pigment, and this has not left its color.

One of the common designs upon the pottery is in the form of a well defined circle. It is a question whether this has any particular significance. Many of the vessels and pitchers and other vessels were designed after the human figure and after some of the common birds and animals, many of the portraits being quite true to life.

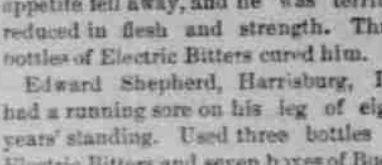
