GOD SAVE THE COMMONWEALTH.

HELD ANY OFFICE OR appointment of profit under the Government of the United States of this State or of any city or town or of any corporation or of any other body corporate, or of any office or appointment of profit under the Government of the United States of this State or of any city or town or of any corporation or of any other body corporate.

QUALIFICATION OF ELECTORS. The following rights and qualifications of electors are secured and prescribed by Article XII of the Constitution of this State.

ELIGIBILITY OF ELECTION OFFICERS. In obedience to the requirements of paragraph 111, of section 19, of said Act of Assembly, so far as the same is not in conflict with section 15, of Article VIII of the Constitution of this Commonwealth, it is provided that every person, occupying the office of a Justice of the Peace, who shall within two months, have
