THE monthly statement of State Treasurer Jackson shows that on the first day of this month there was a balance of \$4,844,929.07 in the general fund of the Treasury, exclusive of monies appropriated to the sinking fund up to that date. THE figures we present our readers to-day speak more eloquently of the glorious Republican victory than anything we could possibly write. Many of the large corporations doing business in Pennsylvania have not yet made settlement of the tax due the state by them and it is thought by the attaches of the auditor general's department that the revenues of this month from this source will more than make up the difference between \$12,272,728.88, the revenues of 1893, and \$11,623,000, the receipts of the past 11 months.
