THE election of last week has very summarily settled that question. The Republicans have not only a majority of Representatives, but also a majority of States in the next Congress. They have elected a majority of the delegations in thirty States, which leaves only fourteen States in doubt.

NOTWITHSTANDING the magnificent victory last week, it is a matter of doubt, and it must be for some time, as to who will support the next Senate.

As it now appears, the Populists will probably hold the balance of power at the organization, but its final political complexion will in all probability depend upon the admission of Utah, Arizona and New Mexico as states, each with two Senators.

A bill for the admission of Utah was passed at the session of Congress by the President and provision is made in that its constitutional question shall meet in March next and the new constitution shall be submitted to a vote of the people in the following November.

As there is ample time to comply with all other formalities, so that its Senators may participate in the organization, Bills for the admission of Arizona and New Mexico passed the last House and are now on the calendar of the Senate and will probably pass that body at an early day in the coming session.
