From the time of a discussion raised at the Farmers' Institute relative to the comparative cost of holding Teachers' and Farmers' Institutes appears that some citizens have not yet grasped the fact that the lecture course is not a money-making scheme, but a money-saving scheme by any means. The County Superintendent hazards his own money at each annual session.

Every seed in the court room was called to order by Chairman Sawyer. Messrs. Sawyer, of Somerset, favored the lecture course as a money-saving scheme. Hon. Wm. Nesbit, of Northumberland county, was then introduced by Senator Critchfield, a highly educated and successful farmer, has traveled extensively, and is looked upon as one of the leading chemists of Pennsylvania. He took "sides" for his subject and spoke at great length upon the subject of soil, and the disposition of the materials contained in them. The impression the speaker endeavored to convey to his audience was that the farmer must be intelligent and studious if he is to succeed fully; he must be able to analyze the soil he is engaged in working in order to determine just what it requires to make it more productive and a high crop is best adapted to producing it. He will have chemistry of the soil taught in the public schools, in order to accomplish this end. The speaker deplored the fact that so many young farmers of the eastern states are taking "horse hounds" advice and going west, where, in a majority of instances, they take up or buy lands that are unproductive or at best will only produce a few crops under the most favorable circumstances, and then they return to be laid in Maryland, the Virginia, Tennessee, and the Carolina which are among the most fertile in the United States, and are better soil than any to be found in the South visited by him. He said that the soil produces certain high priced crops without ever having had a pound of fertilizer applied to it. He said that the chemical condition of the soil are such that it is constantly being enriched and can never become poor.
