Items of Interest.

Gladstone has declined the offer of an American magazine publisher for an article on arbitration at a world's fair.

A bill has been introduced in congress to give all ex-soldiers 75 of age, who served in the civil or Mexican war, \$21 a month.

Henry Michlin, one of the largest cattle owners in Idaho, died last week of disease, was a native of Marchand, Indiana living in Ohio.

Harry Howard, an old resident, gave his entire estate, valued at \$25,000, to the woman who refused to marry him 30 years ago.

The agricultural appropriation bill passed by the House on Thursday carried with it a mandatory order on Secretary Merton to distribute \$100,000 worth of seeds.

Another Blue Book on Armaments has been published at London, the dispatches covering the period between September 1, 1895, and February 31, 1896, were compiled by a committee of delegates from the Embassies of the Six Powers, showing that the total number of persons massacred, concerning whose fate accurate information has been obtained, is 25,000.

At Sunday morning's service in the First Methodist Episcopal church, at Pottsville, Rev. Stephen H. Evans, pastor, who had just risen from a bed of sickness, was unable to finish a well known sermon on the "Healing Power of Christ," and was obliged to quit in the middle of his discourse.

William James, who figured so prominently during the Homestead riots of 1892, was fatally stricken in a fight with a fellow boarder in a Baltimore lodging house on Wednesday.

Enamel Ritenour, charged with the murder of his wife, was found guilty of simple manslaughter and recommended to the mercy of the court by a jury of his kindred.

Madison Dwyer, of Jeannette, one of the jurors, declared during the trial of the case that he would not vote for a man who had been convicted of a crime.

The much-advertised Mahler-Fitzsimmons fight is a thing of the past, and according to Corbett's action in presenting Mahler the championship pugilist of the world.

The fight took place at an almost inaccessible sandy spot on the opposite side of the Rio Grande River, two miles from Langtry, Tex., and it was witnessed by about two hundred spectators.

Fitzsimmons played the same game to his opponent until he had a chance to get a right-hand blow in and landing a lightning right-hand swing on the jaw, and it was all over.

It was the identical blow that knocked out Jim Hall in New Orleans, and it was the same blow that put the better of it. He led into and forced the fighting.

In his eagerness to get at Fitzsimmons he was carried off during a clinch, and was wounded by referee Siler while the referee was knocking out Mahler.

The fight was fought well, but from the start it was not a match for his red-headed opponent, who proved himself one of the craftiest men that ever stepped into the ring.

HUNTINGTON, Va., Feb. 13.—Judge W. P. Thompson, who was Treasurer of this State for eight years, and who was the first judge of the criminal court in this county, has been making extensive preparations for his death. He has had a vault dug and expensively finished, and has purchased a handsome casket for his remains.

Quies Thompson placed an order with Dickey for the casket, but owing to the fact that he had no money to pay for it, the casket was not delivered.

At the trial to-day Thompson appeared and pleaded his own case, and it is probably the first on record in this State where a man has been sued for his own coffin and in such a case defended his own case.

The Judge is one of the most prominent Democrats of this State, and during his life has accumulated a large fortune.
