What a healthful thing to have one jolly person in the house, ready to laugh at anything ludicrous, or even able to create sport at any time of life, and its irresistible side, and its sober side. We need one or more to show the mirth that often trembles just below the surface of painful things. A real impetuous laugh dissipates illusions, sweeps the twilight out of imaginations, and brings honest daylight. But it must be real-no dry, hacking laugh. It should be spontaneous, out-bursting, irresistible, infectious. We have seen men fall to laughing who had not heard the cause of mirth, but had only caught the contagion of other men's laughing. It is hard not to laugh with men who are in earnest about it.
