PHILADELPAIA, April 23d, 1873. In accordance with our Rules and Regulations, Friday, May 30th, will be observed as a MEMORIAL DAY for the purpose of strewing with flowors, or otherwise Decorating the Graves of Comrades who died in deience of their country during the late Rebellion, or who have since possed away. Citizens generally, Military and Civic Associations, Churches and Sunday-Schools should be invited to participate, and in places where there are no Posts of Grand Army, it is hoped that the Citizens will join together for this purpose, that fitting services may be held in every Churchyard or Cemetery where our dead heroes sleep.

The manner of conducting these services is optional with Posts, but those desiring it, can obtain copies of the form of coremonies, as furnished last year by making immediate application to the A. A. G.

Attention is especially invited at this time to the recommendation from National Headquarters last year that flowers and shrubs be planted at each grave, in order that when we are gone, the seasons, in their ceaseless round, may in our stead, adorn the sleeping places of our Comrades."

-A considerable number of the leading physicians of New York city have signed a petition to the State Legislature, praying for the passage of a law suppressing the traffic in in-toxicating liquors. Petitions bearing some forty thousand signatures have also been forwarded, protesting against the exemption of beer from the restraints of the existing laws regulating the sale of intoxicating drinks. There is little doubt that the times require a new and fuller presentation of the wrongs of intemperance, as also a more rigorous enforcement of existing penalties against drunkenness in public. It may be questioned, however, whether legal enactments will ever do more than secure a partial remedy against this curse of modern society. Prohibitory license laws will do something toward checking a traffic that sometimes seems to regard neither the condition nor the interest of the buyer, but it is to be feared they sometimes, also, augment the evil they strive to remove. A law has recently been enacted in France which provides a sliding scale of punishment both fer the incbriate and the man who sells ta him. The law does not propose to prohibit drinking, but rather to terverize the drunkard and those who supply him at improper times. A similar law is canvassed in Great Britian. Why not adopt the plan here? The virtue of temperance, however, like

all other virtues, must proceed, pri-marily, from the mind and conscience.

-George Drake, who we noticed a few weeks ago, as having escaped from the constable of Putneyville, Armstrong county, met a terrible death by jumping from a train in ra-pid motion, on the A. V. R. R. on Tuesday the 22d inst., near Kelley's Station.
