PHILADELPAIA, April 23d, 1873. In accordance with our Rules and Regulations, Friday, May 30th, will be observed as a MEMORIAL DAY for the purpose of strewing with flow-ers, or otherwise Decorating the Graves of Comrades who died in derence of their country during the late Rebellion, or who have since passed away. Citizens generally, Military and Civic Associations, Churches and Sunday-Schools should be invited to participate, and in places where there are no Posts of Grand Army, it is hoped that the Citizens will join together for this purpose, that fitting services may be held in every Churchyard or Cometery where our dead he-

roes sleep. The manner of conducting these services is optional with l'osts, but those desiring it, can obtain copies of the form of ceremonies, as furnished last year by making immediate ap-plication to the A. A. G.

Attention is especially invited at this time to the recommondation from National Headquarters last year, "that flowers and shrubs be planted at each grave, in order that when we are gone, the seasons, in their ceaseless round, may in our stead, adorn the sleeping places of our Comrades."

-Last Saturday afternoon a man named Cambell, formerly from New York, but at present residing at Law-renceburg. fell from the derrick of Capt. Grace's well, on the J. B. Ho struck this pipe about mid way between the centre and outside of the derrick, bending it at right angles, and bounding from this to the floor. He was picked up in an insensible condition and carried to the Campbell House. Drs. Willard of Petrolia, and Pettigrew of Karns City, were summoned who ex-amined his injuries and pronouced them as not being necessarily danger-



LIGHTNING RODS AMONG THE AN-CIENT. The Jewish Temple in Jerusa-lam existed nearly 1,000 years—as the first stood nearly 400, and the last about six hundred years. The roof of the temple was covered with heavily gilt cedar-wood, and was provided from end to end with steel bars, whereof the long points were also gilt .- Scientific American.


