## THE GREAT SLATE CENTRE OF PENN-SYLVANIA.

A correspondent of the Philadelphia Press, writing from Slatington, Pa., The slate business is rather brisker than usual this season, especially here at Slatington, the chief slate quarrying, mining and manufacturing district in the country. 



About 2 o'clock he was assisting in turning a table on which was an engine, when his foot was caught beween the end of the moving rail and the end of the stationary rail, and the skin torn on the upper and under side between the great toe and that next to it. The muscles were ground to a pulpy mass, and Drs. Davis and Davinney decided on the amputation of the foot. The unfortunate man was suffering terrible agony. Chloroform was administered, and the end of the foot taken off a short distance behind the toes, by sawing through the two outside metatarsal bones and unjoint-

ing the three middle ones. He was comparatively easy after the operation. Throughout his trying ordeal he bore himself manfully. Im-mediately upon the occurrence of the accident a locomotive had been despatched for his wife. She arrived about the time of the completion of the operation, which took place in an upper room of the Taylor House, but was not allowed to enter his room until it was set to rights, and the sufferer's foot was bandaged and under the cover. He had requested that she should be told that his foot had been "pinched," and showed much less disress than she. After the foot was off he inquired of the doctors how he should be able to kick anybody with that foot, and wanted to know if there was anybody present who could tell him where he could get a hand organ.
