Court Proceedings.

Courts met Monday, May 25, 1873, at 2 p. m. Present, Hon. L. D. Wetmore, President Judge, and Hons. J. A. Proper, and A. Cook, Associates. Proceeded to the disposition of the various business before them, and continued in session until 6 p. m. Friday, May 29, transacting a large amount of business.

The majority of the civil list was continued, some of the cases being unable to be reached owing to the pressure of criminal cases.

The following were disposed of as follows:

John Begon for *vs.* L. Hillbrow, *appeal*. Def't by Attorney withdraws appearance and plea, and on motion judgment by default.

Weible & Hopkins *vs.* J. J. McCaslin, *assumpsit*. Non-suit taken on motion with leave of court.

The Fourth National Bank of Pittsburgh *et al.* vs. George S. Hunter *et al.*, *garnishee*. Verdict for plaintiffs for the land described in the writ.

John A. Dodd *vs.* Benj. R. Cole, *foreign attachment*. Verdict for plaintiff \$148.25.

James E. Brown *vs.* Bennett Dabbs, *et al.*, *ejectment*. Under instructions from the Court jury find verdict for defendants for 315 acres of land described in the writ, and verdict for plaintiff for balance given.

Corydon Turner *vs.* Hiram Heath, *et al.*, *capias*. Settled.

Jas. Bebe *et ux* *vs.* Hiram Heath, *et al.*, *capias*. Verdict for plaintiffs for \$80.

The following were the criminal cases disposed of:

Commonwealth *vs.* Judson Childs, *indictment*, false pretenses. Verdict, not guilty, but defendant pay one-half the costs, and prosecutor, John A. Proper, the other half.

Com. *vs.* Andrew J. Small, *indictment*, assault and battery. Not guilty, but defendant to pay one-half the costs, and prosecutor, Jacob T. Overlander, pay the other half.

Com. *vs.* Jeremiah W. Briggs, *indictment*, larceny. Not guilty.

Com. *vs.* Samuel Walker, *indictment*, attempting to shoot. Not guilty.
