—Millerstown has out-phenixed the Phoenix in rising from her ashes. Sixty-nine houses were destroyed by the fire on the first day of April last, and one hundred and twenty-three have since been erected. Among these are twenty-nine consecrated to the needs of the thirsty. As a precaution against future visitations by fire the citizens are building a brick reservoir to hold seven thousand barrels of water, which will be supplied by artesian wells.—Spectator.

—In the saw mill of Andrew Kaul, situated one mile east of this place, the carriage which carries the logs to the saw, jumped the track while the saw was running, which broke every tooth out of the saw, it having come in contact with the head block.
