### County Committee Meeting.

In pursuance of the call of the Chairman, the Republican County Committee met at the office of M. W. Tate, in Tionesta, Saturday, August the first.

The object of the meeting was stated to be, the propriety of submitting the Rules of 1868 and 1870 as published in the FOREST REPUBLICAN of the 29th July, to the people at the next primary meeting, on Saturday, the 15th day of August, to determine by ballot which set of Rules shall govern the party thereafter.

The Townships present were Harmony, Hickory, Jenks, Green, Tionesta and Tionesta Borough.

It was thereupon moved by James Green, Esq., that this committee cause tickets to be printed for distribution at the polls on Saturday, August the 15th next, said tickets headed as follows:

For Rules of 1868,

For Rules of 1870,

and that upon vote being had thereon, the returns thereof be made in the usual manner of making returns, and that the Rules obtaining the majority of the votes cast, shall be declared by

the Return Judges at their meeting next after the said Primary, to be the Rules which shall thereafter govern the action of the party at its Primary Meetings. Carried.
