The Townships present were Harmony, Hickory, Jenks, Green, Tionesta and Tionesta Borough.

It was thereupon moved by James Green, Esq., that this committee cause tickets to be printed for distribution at the polls on Saturday, August the 15th next, said tickets headed as follows:

and that upon vote being had thereon, the returns thereof be made in the usual manner of making returns, and that the Rules obtaining the majority of the votes cast, shall be declared by

the Return Judges at their meeting next after the said Primary, to be the Rules which shall thereafter govern the action of the party at its Primary Meetings. Carried.

On motion the committee then adjourned. MILES W. TATE, Chairman.
