Also, that in the 4th section of the act of Assembly entitled "An act relating to elections and for other purposes." appro-ved April 16th 1559, it is onacted that the 18th section shall not be so construed as to prevent any militia or borough officer from serving as Judge, Inspector or Clerk, at any general or special election in this nwealth.

A further supplement to the election laws of this Commonwealth: Whereas, by an act of the Congress of the United States, entitled "An act to amend the several acts hereto-fore passed to provide for the onrolling and calling out of the national forces, and for other purposes," and approved March 2d, 1865. All persons who have deserted the military or naval services of the Uni-ted States, and who have been discharged or rolieved from the penalty or disability therein provided, are deemed and taken to have voluntarily relinquished and for-felted their rights to become citizens, and are deprived of exercising any rights of citizenship hereof: And whereas, persons not citizens of the United States, are under the constitu-tion and laws of Pennsylvania qualified electors of this Commonwealth--BEC. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Common-

SEC. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Common-wealth of Pennsylvaniain General Assem-bly met, and it is hereby enacted by the same and in all elections hereafter to be held in this Commonwealth; it shall be unlawfut for the Judges or Inspectors of any such election to receive any ballot or ballots from any persons embraced in the provisions, and subject to the disabilities imposed by said act of Congress, approved March 3d, 1865. And it shall be unlawful for any such person to offer to vote any for any such person to offer to vote any such ballot or ballots. Size, 2. That if any such judge or inspec-tors of election or any of them shall receive

or consent to receive any such unlawful ballot or ballots from any such disqualified

shall be deposited in separate ballot boxes. The Judges of the aforesaid districts shall representatively take charge of the certifi-cates of return of the election of their re-spective districts, and produce them at the Prothonotary's office in the Borough of Tionesta, as follows: "All Judges living within twelve miles of the prothonotary's office, or within twenty-four miles, if their residence be in a town, village or city upon the line of a railroad leading to the county sent, shall, before two colock, p. m., on the line of a railroad leading to the county seat, shall, before two oclock, p. m., on WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER FOCRTH, 1874, and all other judges shall, before twelve o'clock, m., on THURSDAY, NO-VEMBER FIFTH, 1874, deliver said re-turns, together with the return sheets, to the prothonotary of the court of common pleas of Forest county, which said return sheets shall be filed, and the day and hour of filing marked thereon, and shall be pre-served by the prothonotary for public in-spection." spection."


