

#### PENNSYLVANIA

The following news we get from this morning's papers. Of course a good deal of the vote in all sections is estimated and official returns may materially change the result:

PHILADELPHIA, November 8. Monroe county, estimated Demo-cratic majority, 1,800.

Chester county re-elects Washing-ton Townsend, Republican, by from 1,500 to 2,000 majority.

Ритевинон, Nov. 4-12:30 a. m. Election returns are very mengre and come in slowly. Up to this hour it is impossible to give any definite result. In Allegheny county the State ticket will be elected by from 1,500 to 2,000 Republican majority. General Negley, Republican candidate for Congress from the Twenty-Second District, is probably defeated.

The Democrats will elect six and probably seven out of the fourteen candidates for the Legislature, a Dem-

ocratic gain of five members.

General Harry White, Republican candidate for Congress from the Twen-ty-Fifth District, will be elected by about 1,400.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 3. Schuylkill county gives a Demo-eratic majority of 800. Berks, a Dem-ocratic majority of about 4,500 for Lieutenant Governor, and for Aymer, Democrat, for Congress, 4,000. Dau-phin, 1,000 Republican majority, Clinton county, a Democratic majority of Adams, 400 Democratic majority. Cumberland, 600 Democratic majority. Franklin, a Democratic majority of 200.

PITTSBURGH, Nov. 4. Later returns show Hopkins, Democrat, for Congress in the Twenty-secand District, is elected by about 500 majority and the Democrats have elected seven members to the Legisla-ture in Allegheny county.

The election to day was the most hot-

ly contested ever known in this county. Harry White, Republican, for Congress in the Twenty fifth District is thought to be elected by a small majority, and Lawrence, Republican, in the Twenty-fourth District.

The estimated Republican majority in the State will be about 10,000. The State is Republican by about 10,000 on the State ticket.

### ARKANSAS.

LITTLE ROCK, Nov. 3. The election to-day passed off without disturbance. A full vote was polled. The Democrats carry the First and it is thought the Fourth ward. The Republicans the Second and Third. The vote in the city was between Wilshire, Democrat, and Hynes Republican, for Congress. The chances are that Hynes carries Pulaski county.

Advices from Saline are that every was for Wilshire. In Faulkner, Wilshire was largely ahead. The Democrats claim his election by a considerable majority. There is no news from other districts.

LITTLE ROCK, Nov. 3. Full returns from the city show a ma-jority of 19 for Judge Wilshire, the Democratic candidate for Congress. The Democrats elect three out of five Aldermen.

#### WISCONSIN.

MILWAUKEE, Nov. 3. Returns indicate that the Republicans have elected Williams in the First Congressional District, Caswell in the Second, Magoon in the Third, Rucke in the Seventh and McDill in the Eighth. The Democrats elect Hynke in the Fourth, Burchard in the Fifth, and the Sixth is close and doubtful, with chances in favor of Cimball, Republican. There is a strong probability that the Republicans will have a majority on a joint ballot of the Legislature, thus securing a Republican Senator to succeed Carpenter. There is but little doubt that the Republicans will have a majority in the State at large.
