Bean vs. Hows et al, verdict for defendants. Garfield vs. Hunter, verdict for plaintiff for \$70.75. Overlander vs. Sciall, verdict for plaintiff for costs.

The following criminal cases were tried: Com. vs. Wesley Ingalls and Barnabb Allen, verdict not guilty. Com. vs. Horace Cornelius, verdict guilty. Sentenced to pay a fine of \$5 to Commonwealth, and costs of prosecution, and remain in custody of Sheriff until sentence complied with.
