Meeting of Return Judges.

Pursuant to the primary election rules published in our last issue, the Return Judges of the Republican Primary Elections from the various districts of the county met in the Arbitration Room of the Court House in this place on Tuesday afternoon the 10th inst.

By virtue of his office of Chairman of the County Committee, W. P. Mercillott, Esq., took his seat as Chairman of the meeting, and on motion, Messrs. S. J. Setley, and H. S. Brockway were elected Secretaries.

Motion, that meeting proceed to business with closed doors. Carried. Motion, that the Editor of the Republican Co. paper and members of the County Committee be admitted. Carried.

The Primary Rules were read by the Chairman, after which the returns were handed in by the various return judges, and read by the chairman. (The returns, as read, are published in the shape of a table in another place.)

On motion the return judges proceeded to nominate a candidate for State Senate. W. R. Dunn was nominated unanimously. On motion the following gentleman were appointed Senatorial Conferees: Jno. Thompson, D. Graham and S. J. Setley.

On motion T. D. Collins, of Hickory, was nominated for the office of Co. Surveyor. On motion, adjourned. H. S. BROCKWAY, Sec's. S. J. SETLEY, Sec's.
