It is certainly one of the most extensive fertile tracts, in an almost level position, and suitable condition for pleasant farming, that we know of this side of the Western prairies. We found some of the oldest farms apparently just as profitably productive as when first cleared of forest finty or a hundred years ago.

The goologist would soon discover the cause of this continued fortility. The whole country is a marine deposit, and all through the soil we found evidences of calcarcous substances, generally in the form of indurated calcarcous marl, showing many distinct forms of ancient shells, of the tertiary formation; and this marly substance is scattered all through the soil, in a very comminuted form, and in the exact condition most casely assimmilated by such plants as the farmer desires to cultivate.
