ELK CITY, July 16.

day night the tank shop in the rear of Moss' tobacco store, on the north side of Main street, was set on fire. An alarm was immediately sounded which called the residents of the town and surrounding country to the scene of the conflagration. Gottschalk's hardware store then fell and was followed by a vacant building belonging to A. Webber. The drug store of Mr. Webber was next burned. The hardware store of W. W. Gibbs & Co. then fell in, followed by Hoffman's saloon. Coyle's furniture store then gave way to the devouring element and the American Hotel, kept by Mr. Doubles, was next cremated. A barber shop, saloon, Chinese laundry and another saloon were burned in the order named.

The clearhorded men saw by this time that the only hope of saving the town lay in tearing down buildings, loveled the building of Albert Owen, then Coyle's building occupied by Updegraff's grocery and last the hardware store of D. M. Sample.
