He is evidently in earnest when he says : "It is for us, gentlemen of the South, to call off the desperadoes. That is the whole business, and there's no use mineing matters. By or before 1880 want that question sent to the rear. It is not, woe to the North, wee to th, wee to Republican Govern-America."

-There is a little scrap from the record of Amos C. Noyes which will not endear him to the colored citizens and the old anti-slavery men. While in the Legislature, in 1863, Mr. Noyes voted in favor of "An act to prevent the immigration of negroes and mulattoes into this State." The first section of this bill made it a pewal offense for any person of color to move into Pennsylvania from any State or Territory; and the second section provided penalties for any person, white or colored, who aided in bringing negroes or mulattoes into the State. For such an infamous law Amos C. Noyes voted. To-day he is begging votes among the same people, whom, fourteen years ago he either wanted to drive into slavery or incarcerate in Northern prisons be-

cause of their active opposition to that

institution .- Clearfield Journal.

-We commend the more serious will tone of the President's speeches at the South. The silly and trifling material sometimes used, was laid aside at the cities of the South, where he had the opportunity of speaking before representative Southern audiences, and the importance of good feeling between the sections, premoted by good faith on the part of the South.
