OBITUARY.

P. O. CONVER. Mr. P. O. CONVER, Editor of the Forest Press, died on Tuesday, March 19, 1878, at 8 o'clock A. M., aged 45 years, 1 month and 17 days.

Mr. Conver was born in Montgomery County, Pa. When six years of age he came with his father, George Conover, to Richland township, Venango county, near Emlenton. At the age of 16, he entered the office of E. S. Durban, who was then publishing the Advocate and Journal at Franklin, and there completed his trade. He became a very speedy compositor, and in addition to his regular labor, he issued a little sheet monthly, called the Town Pump, which is well remembered to this day by all the old and middle-aged citizens of Franklin. At the age of 20 years he went to Kansas with Geo. W. Brown, and worked with him, we believe, until Brown's office was destroyed by a pro-slavery mob. He then moved to Topeka, then a small town, but now a thriving city and Capital of the State, and established a paper called the Kansas Journal. This paper had an existence of one year, and its publication was stopped because of the border troubles, and of threatening letters he was constantly in receipt of. About this time the war commenced, and he came East, enlisted in the 4th Pa. Cavalry, and served in that regiment until the war closed. Shortly after this he established a paper at Emlenton, his old home, called the Allegheny Valley Echo, which was not a financial success, and passed out of his hands. He came to Tionesta on Christmas, 1867, and after getting the citizens interested in the project he started the Forest Press, which is still running. Since we have been acquainted with him—ten years—he has been a hard-working, industrious man, never having help in his office except on press days, and, very rarely, when he has been sick. Some six months ago he was attacked by dyspepsia, and has been going down steadily ever since. It was not supposed, however, by those who knew his condition best, that he would not eventually recover, until two or three weeks ago, since which time he sank rapidly until he died.

He was a man who had many warm friends, and he will be remembered in Forest County as long as any of the present generation survive. The paper will be issued by Mr. J. E. Wenk, for a month or such a matter, and the probabilities are that arrangements will be made to continue its publication regularly hereafter.

Just before his death he requested S. D. Irwin, Esq. to write his obituary for the Press, and it will appear in the next issue of that paper. We are indebted to Mr. Irwin for most of the facts in the above sketch.

The funeral will take place from the late residence of the deceased at 10 o'clock A. M. to-morrow.

RICHARD L. IRWIN. Died, at Olean, N. Y., March 13, 1878, RICHARD L. IRWIN, aged 32 years.

He was the youngest son of Hon. Richard Irwin, of Franklin, Pa., and was well and favorably known by many in this section of the State as a young man of promise. His business qualifications were excellent. He was industrious and enterprising, and had many friends; a man of mild disposition, yet firm withal; of command of temper, open, social, cheerful and hopeful in character, he formed many lasting attachments.

For the greater part of his life he was in the banking business; lately he was engaged in oil developments near Bradford. He had been at Olean just about a month, and seemed to be on the highway of success. The immediate cause of his death was rheumatism induced by exposure in that Northern Oil Field. About a week previous to his death he was down toward Bradford, examining a large oil lease in which he had become interested, and being exposed to rain throughout the day, became chilled, which led to his late illness. He leaves a wife and two children of tender years. In brief it may be said of him, "None knew him but to love him," "None named him but to praise."
