In 1876 he was elected to the Senate for two years, carrying his district by four hundred more votes than were cast for Rutherford B. Hayes. The personal appearance of Senator

Stone is prepossessing, without being distinguished or dramatic. He impresses one with his sincerity, integrity, and good judgment upon the most cas-2827 ual acquaintance. He is about the medium height, of rather light build, but wiry and capable of great endu-rance. His hair, whiskers, eyes, and 3826 complexion are dark, his nose is prominent, and his features clear cut and 2826regular. He dresses with neatness, but not for display. He has the culture, bearing, and impress of a gentleman, and always preserves his dignity, but without any approach to pride or ar-rogance. He is at once a scholar, a 2826 statesman, and a man of the people. Born poor, cradled in adversity, and reared to self-dependence, he is the architect of his own fortune and a 217 rising man in the State. His record, public and private, is without a blem-mb, and at home, where he is best 216 known he is esteemed the highest.
