School Directors' Convention.

To the School Directors of Forest County: GENTLEMEN:—In pursuance of the forty-third section of the act of May, 1854, you are hereby notified to meet in convention, at the Court House in Tionesta on the first Tuesday in May, A. D. 1878, being the 7th day of the month, at one o'clock in the afternoon, and select *viva voce*, by a majority of the whole number of directors present, one person of literary and scientific acquirement, and of skill and experience in the art of teaching, as county superintendent, for three succeeding years; determine the amount of compensation for the same; and certify the result to the State Superintendent, at Harrisburg, as required by the thirty-ninth and fortieth sections of said act.

Notice U. S. Internal-Revenue Special Taxes.

Under the Revised Statutes of the United States, Sections 3232, 3237, 3238, and 3238, and 3139, every person engaged in any business, avocation, or employment, which renders him liable to a special tax, is required to procure and place and keep conspicuously in his establishment or place of business a STAMP denoting the payment of said special tax for the special-tax year beginning May 1, 1878. Section 3224, Revised Statutes, designates who are liable to special tax. A return, as required on Form 11, is also required

by law of every person liable to special tax as above. Severe penalties are prescribed for non-compliance with the foregoing requirements, or for continuing in business after April 30, 1878, without payment of tax.

Application should be made to James C. Brown, Collector of Internal Revenue, at Greenville, Pa.
