Rules for the Republican Primary Elections of Forest County.

1. The candidates for the several offices shall have their names announced in one or more of the county papers at least three weeks previous to the Primary Meetings, stating the office, and subject to the action of the party at the said primary meetings.

2. The voters belonging to the Republican party in each township or borough, shall meet on a day to be designated by the County Committee, at the usual places of helding spring elections, at 2 o'clock, P. M., and proceed to elect one person for Judge, and two persons for Clerks, who shall form a Board of Election to receive votes and determine who are the proper persons to vote, and who shall hold the polls open until 7 o'clock P. M. After the polls are opened, the candidates announced shall be ballotted for; the name of each person voting shall be written on a list at the time of voting, no person being allowed to vote more than once for each office.

3. After the polls are closed the board shall proceed to count the votes that each candidate has received, and make out the returns accordingly, to be certified by the Judge and attested by the Clerks.

### AN ORDINANCE,

PRESCRIBING SANITARY MEASURES FOR TIONESTA BORGUGH. Be it ordained by the Town Council of the

Borough of Tionesta, and it is hereby or-dained by authority of the same: That from and after the passage of this ordinance, it shall be the duty of the Town Council to appoint, annually, a Medical Health Officer, and a Sanitary Committee consisting of three or more persons, whose duty it shall be to abate and compel the abatement of all such nuisanses as dead animals, bad drains, clogged gutters, and the throwing out of slops or vegetable or animal matter in exposed places, and, at any time, when in their judgment it shall be deemed necessary, to compel the use of such disinfectants as they may order, in privies, drains, etc. Also, to compel the isolation of all persons known to have been exposed to small-pox, and empower-ing the Committee and Health Officer to provide suitable place for, and proper care of persons afflicted with this disease. Also to compel the vaccination of all children attending public schools.

Any person neglecting or refusing to comply with the requirements of the said Health Officer and Sanitary Committee acting in accordance with this ordinance, shall be subject to a fine of not more than fifty dollars, or imprisonment not exceeding sixty days, or both, at the discretion of the Health Officer and Sanitary Com-
