AN ORDINANCE. PRESCRIBING SANITARY MEASURES FOR

TIONESTA BOROUGH. Be it ordained by the Town Council of the

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Borough of Tionesta, and it is hereby or-dained by authority of the same: That from and after the passage of this ordinance, it shall be the duty of the Town Council to appoint, aunually, a Medical Health Officer, and a Sanitary Committee consisting of three or more persons, whose duty it shall be to abate and compel the abatement of all such nuisances as dead animals, had drains, dlogged gutters, and the throwing out of slops or vegetable or animal matter in exposed places, and, at Diffice. HOWE TOWNSHIP. Monday, July 1st, Brooks' Store, Brookston. Those liable for Mercantile License or 1878 will save \$1.00 by paying be-bere July 1st, 1878. the throwing out of slops or vegetable or animal matter in exposed places, and, at be deemed necessuary, to compel the use of such disinfectants as they may order, in privies, orains, etc. Also, to compel the isolation of all persons known to have been exposed to small-pex, and empower-ing the Committee and Heatth Officer to provide suitable place for, and proper care of persons afflicted with this disease. Also to compel the vaccination of all children

attending public schools. Any person neglecting or refusing to comply with the requirements of the said Health Officer and Sanitary Committee acting in accordance with this ordinance, shall be subject to a fine of not more than shar be subject to a fine of not increased fifty dollars, or imprisonment not excessi-ing sixty days, or ooth, at the discretion of the Health Officer and Sanitary Committee.


