Our Washington Letter.
 Special to the REPUBLICAN.
 WASHINGTON, D. C., June 23, '78.
 [The extreme length of our correspondent's letter this week precludes the insertion of the greater portion of it. We extract that part in which this section will be most directly interested, showing, as it does, in what estimation our Member of Congress, Gen. Harry White, is held in Washington.—Ed.]
 Among the new Members, no one has made a better record than General Harry White. Fearless in peace and politics, as he was brave in war, his voice is not silent when the traitor speaks. With a quick, decisive judgment in all matters suddenly sprung upon him, he rarely makes a mistake. In his successful management of the appropriation for the two much abused rivers in Western Pennsylvania, of which Hendricks B. Wright, himself a Pennsylvanian, professed never to have heard, there was a large amount of skillful diplomacy, and it was necessary to success, in securing the passage of the bill. The pretended ignorance, and coarseness, about which there was no pretense, of Wright was disgusting, and formed a striking contrast to the dignity and earnestness of White.
 The results of the proposed improvements, will not be felt so much in the streams become famous as the Kiskiminetas and Conemaugh, but the improvement in those rivers will affect the Allegheny river, as the Kiskiminetas is one of its largest tributaries, and the Allegheny is an essential element to the oil producing regions of Western Pennsylvania. These improvements will help to make the Allegheny navigable at all seasons of the year, which is necessary, with the large amount of traffic from that part of the country, and which is now almost entirely monopolized by the railroads, at their own prices, destroying utterly the interests of the small dealers in oil, who cannot afford to pay the prices.
 The Red Bank river, emptying into the Allegheny at or near Brady's Bend, was, for years, almost a useless stream, permeating a section of the country remote from railroads, and the most productive pine growing regions in the North. By an appropriation from the Legislature of the State, and some help from the Red Bank Navigation Company, an easy and cheap outlet for the vast productions of that part of the State, was formed, and no one sneers, or ridicules the result.
 A connection, with the sea, by an inter-water route, is possible, in the future by the improvement of these streams, by way of Lake Erie and Chautauqua Lake, with the Allegheny river, and by the Kiskiminetas and Conemaugh with the Juniata; thence a tunnel through the mountains of three miles, connecting with the Susquehanna, in the East, thence by the bay to the ocean.
 At all events the appropriation was secured, and the people of his District may thank him for three hundred thousand dollars' worth of work thrown into their midst in these hard times. Harry White never forgets the interests of the workmen, and they must not forget that he is the friend they want to represent them. His head is cool and clear in emergencies, and among the dozens and twenties of drunken Congressmen, during the last hours of the session, Harry White stood calm and serene, working with the deliberation of a man who knew that upon himself and a few others rested the weight of Government.

AN ORDINANCE,
 PRESCRIBING SANITARY MEASURES FOR TIONESTA BOROUGH.
 Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Borough of Tionesta, and it is hereby ordained by authority of the same, That from and after the passage of this ordinance, it shall be the duty of the Town Council to appoint, annually, a Medical Health Officer, and a Sanitary Committee consisting of three or more persons, whose duty it shall be to abate and compel the abatement of nuisances, such as dead animals, bad drains, clogged gutters, and the throwing out of slops or vegetable or animal matter in exposed places, and, at any time, when in their judgment it shall be deemed necessary, to compel the use of such disinfectants as they may order, in privies, drains, etc. Also, to compel the isolation of all persons known to have been exposed to small-pox, and empowering the Committee and Health Officer to provide suitable place for, and proper care of persons afflicted with this disease. Also to compel the vaccination of all children attending public schools.
 Any person neglecting or refusing to comply with the requirements of the said Health Officer and Sanitary Committee acting in accordance with this ordinance, shall be subject to a fine of not more than fifty dollars, or imprisonment not exceeding sixty days, or both, at the discretion of the Health Officer and Sanitary Committee.
