THE GRAND RALLY.

According to notice given, Governor Hartranft and Gen. Beaver arrived in town on last Monday. They were met at the depot by a large delegation of our citizens, and escorted to the Central House, preceded by the Rescue Cornet Band, of Tidioute.

An organization was effected by the appointment of M. W. Tate, Esq., as President of the meeting, Messrs. C. W. Clark, C. F. Gillespie, Peter Barry and John H. White Vice Presidents, and Henry Wilkins and W. R. Dunn, Secretaries.

After music by the band, Governor Hartranft was introduced, and was greeted with loud and prolonged applause. The Governor dealt mainly with the condition of the State finances under Republican and Democratic administrations, and showed plainly how much better the finances had been handled under Republican than under Democratic management.

The meeting was the largest ever held in Forest County, and we doubt not but its effects will be felt next Tuesday at the polls. County Chairman E. L. Davis, Esq., and others, directed by him, deserve much praise for their good management of the whole affair.

We cannot close without saying a word for Rescue Cornet Band. It is composed of a good class of men, and led by Mr. A. N. Squiers, one of the old musical stand-bys of this section. Their selections were excellent, and their execution admirable.
