Thomas J. Van Gieson No. 34 Dec. Term vs. Wilmer S. Wood et al. Sur. Mech. In Forest County, ss.

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to the Sheriff of said County Greeting: Whereas, Thomas J. Van Gieson hath filed a claim in our Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Forest, against Wilmer S. Wood, owner or reputed owner of the leasehold and personal property and Wilmer S. Wood contractor and employer, and John A. Proctor owner or reputed owner of the real estate, for the sum of thirty-nine dollars with interest from Aug. 29, 1878, for work and labor done and performed and material furnished for a certain building, to-wit: A1 that certain derrick, engine house, boiler, engine, hand-wheel house, tubing, eight-inch casing, about three hundred feet thereof, inch pipe, and inch-and-a-half pipe for steam and water connections, rubber hose, about seventy feet thereof; said property more particularly hereinafter described, and the leasehold and real estate upon which the said personal property is located. The property is located on the leasehold situate in the township of Tionesta, in the county of Forest, and State of Pennsylvania, said leasehold more particularly bounded and described as follows: Bounded on the west by the Daniel Stow place, on the north by lands of Sickles, on the east by lands of H. H. May, and on the south by lands of John A. Proctor, being the north half of the Noble farm, owned by John A. Proctor, and crosses Peter's run at right angles. The said derrick is of frame seventy-two feet in height and twenty feet square at the bottom. The engine house is of frame and twelve feet square and eight feet high. The boiler is a fifteen horse power boiler and of the Erie City make. The engine is a fifteen horse power engine with a center draft and is of Brown & Struthers' make, of Warren, Pennsylvania. The tubing, casing pipe and belting are such as are usual and necessary in the ordinary operations of boring and mining for oil. And whereas, it is alleged that the said claim remains due and unpaid to the said Thomas J. Van Gieson, now we command you that you make known to said defendant, and to all such persons as may be known to occupy the said leasehold, and to appear before the said Judges of our said Court, at the Court of Common Pleas for the County of Forest, on the fourth Monday of December next, to show if any thing they know or have to say why the said sum of thirty-nine dollars, with interest from Aug. 29, 1878, should not be levied of the above named property, to the use of the said plaintiff, according to the form and effect of the act of Assembly in such case made and provided, if to him it shall seem expedient.
