Our Washington Letter.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 24, '79.

The Republicans having agreed not to filibuster against the wild schemes of the Greenback Democracy, on Monday the communists had their day. The better policy for our party is to antagonize these schemes on their passage and expose the unwisdom of them before the country.

The Democrats begin to waver in their hostility about starving the Gov't

if their bills are vetoed. Having become pretty well convinced that the President will disapprove their schemes, they are at a loss what to do, and are putting off the evil day as far as possible.

Prof. Gangeo has met with such great success in his experiments in "freezing out" the yellow fever and other contagious diseases that private capitalists have concluded to invest money in another vessel, similar to the disinfecting vessel of the Gov't, to be stationed in the lower Mississippi river, and to manufacture ice for the cities there.

Capt. Jas. B. Eads, the author of the Mississippi improvements, which have so increased the navigable value of the mouth of that great river, has been the victim of abuse at the hands of some newspaper strikers, and he has replied to them several times in vigorous style. Their trouble arises from the fact that Capt. Eads declines to purchase them with the money he receives from Gov't for his work.

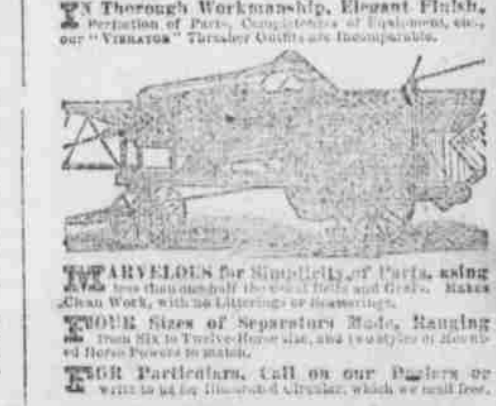
