Men often speak of faith in meetings. It is a refreshing subject to talk about, especially "a faith grounded on hope." We could write a cart load of sentiments on this higher faith, reducing to black and white many theories never dreamed of by the theologians but we wont do it. Yet the man who works industriously for the developement of trade, for the benefit of the world (and himself too) in "wild-entting" for oil, is entitled to credit; and is an example of faith, especially when by his acts he proves that that faith is backed by works. Yet to take that German poets'line as a standard: "That he who makes one blade of grass to grow where not one grew before is a PRETTIEST, philanthropist," he who puts down an oil well, a more uncertain thing, and spends his funds in developeing the resources of earth, dives into the mysteries of nature, to bless his section of country with prosperity, makes the desert to "bud and blossom as the rose," from a financial standpoint. Have we such persons as we have described among us? Let us look about and see. Dr. Garson Shamburg, a gentleman of great experience in the oil developements, and whose name is historical in the Venango and Butler Districts, has moved into Forest, and is pleasantly situated at the mouth of West Hickory. He is a man of great ingenuity and foresight. He has become interested in that valley largely, and is developing and producing to-day large quantities of oil, as any one can see who will look at the line of his oil wells and works extending from the mouth of the creek up as far as the Fogle Farm. It is hardly worth while now to say, (what the commercial world knows) that the West Hickory oil eclipses any lubricating oil in the market. This has long been demonstrated. Dr. S. has got the best of machinery, and is already making these old wells tell. The Dr. has unlimited faith in the territory.

Then there is Geo. M. Kepler, who has put up a rig on the Charles Hill farm, four miles above Tionesta, and will soon have a well down. His derrick and other buildings as well as "the enginery for action" are on the sod. we can only have hope that his efforts may be crowned with the success which those efforts merit. He, too, has strong faith, and that faith mixed with the saud to go ahead.

Of the Grandin Bros, who are, through their efficient agent, Peter Berry, sinking down wells in the wilderness of Salmon Creek and Balltown, you have heretofore apprized your readers by notes at various times. 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
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
