A REMINISCENCE.

My Italian Dance.

Whilst strolling leisurely one evening around the bay of Naples, between the towns of Sorrento and Castelasmare, I was so taken up with the surroundings I did not notice the approach of darkness. Night overtook me several miles from my intended destination.

Once while looking around me I caught a glimpse of a faint light on the mountain side. Some one must live there I thought. I had always had a great desire to spend a night in an Italian hut to get a better idea of their true home life. A path led away from the road which was evidently the one leading to the hut. A moment later I was wending my way up the mountain side, at least, upon a visit. Scarcely had I got where I could see that the rays came through a little window than strains of music as sweet as the perfumes of a tropical garden, came floating to me on the evening zephyrs. I hastened on with delight and soon reached the front door—it proved to be the back and side door as well. I tapped gently. No answer—the music deadened the sound. I knocked a second time much louder. A voice answered in Italian, I presume it meant come in, at any rate in I went. "Good evening," I said in their own tongue. An old but pleasant looking man, apparently about sixty years of age, clad in a pair of coarse linen pantaloons, a colored shirt with the sleeves rolled up to his elbows, the collar thrown open, looked at me with surprise as he lowered his violin from his shoulder, and in a pleasant voice answered: "Good evening sir." He proceeded to make further remarks, but by certain gestures I gave him to understand I could not speak his language. I took a professed rustic stool, and began to survey my surroundings. Just opposite me sat a pretty, black haired and dark eyed girl over whose head not more than twenty summers had passed, and who up to this time had remained silent. I nodded a good evening which she returned with a smile so sweet as to open up a channel in my heart that had long been closed. Her features were dark and finely moulded, her mouth small and when she laughed disclosed a set of pearly white teeth; her eyes seemed to pierce my inmost recesses with a fascination indescribable; her hair hung in natural curls over her naked shoulders; her dress was of a style common to the peasant girls of Southern Italy. It was low in the neck—exceedingly so—and the skirt scarcely reached below the knees. I don't know why they wear them so; it may be for convenience sake, or it may be for the sake of economy. I didn't know. I never inquired. She wore a pair of dark stockings and slippers with wooden soles. To the right of her sat, half asleep, a domestic-looking young lad three or four years her junior, and obviously her brother. The room and furniture bore the appearance of cleanliness, a rarity in Italy. In one corner sat a bed neatly spread with clean linen. A little table stood in another corner, and an arm-chair besides the four stools we occupied was the only furniture visible. I motioned to the old gentleman to give us some music, and he immediately started out on an air from a well-known Italian opera. It was enchanting.
