

THE next State fair will be held in Philadelphia.

THERE is a strong suspicion that our Democratic House of Representatives is becoming overheated trying to keep up with the Republican Senate's reform measures.

Two hundred people of Indiana county, including ministers and deacons, have been speculating in grain. One minister, two deacons and twenty-one others are now bankrupt.

OUT of forty six States and Territories, only eight, namely, Maine, Connecticut, Idaho, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Mexico, New York and Washington Territory, have laws whereby an honest debtor can be imprisoned.

GOVERNOR FOSTER, of Ohio, gives the wise advice to the Republicans that in nominating candidates for the Legislature this year they avoid pledging them to vote for any particular aspirant for the United States Senatorship. Name the best men, elect them and trust to their good sense.

THE month of February appears to have given to the country five of its most distinguished citizens: Horace Greeley, Alexander H. Stephens, Abraham Lincoln, George Washington and Henry W. Longfellow, in the order named. It was also on February 1st that Washington was first elected; and on the 4th the Confederate States organized, and on the 9th their Congress met.

CONGRESSMAN RANDALL is quoted as predicting that the Democrats will be defeated in 1884 if they defeat the tariff bill now pending in Congress. Mr. Randall has an elongated cranium, but the descent to his diminutive game is not very deep in this instance. The Democrats will be defeated in 1884 under any circumstances, and the defeat of the Tariff bill now will give them something to offer as an explanation then.—Venango Citizen.

TWENTY-FIVE Chinamen killed by the powder explosion at Berkeley, Cal., were buried with considerable parade. On arriving at the cemetery, it was found that permits had been issued for the burial of twenty-four and the sexton would admit that number only. Which body should be excluded as the twenty fifth? The question was left to the crowd of live Chinamen, and they settled it by means of a terrific fight, in which various weapons made various wounds.

THE extension of the Roberts torpedo patent having been virtually defeated, the movement is now directed against the original patent. The United States Government has, through Attorney General Brewster, brought suit in the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia to vacate the patent, and application will be made to-day at Utica, N. Y., for an injunction to restrain further proceedings against the users of the patent until the case is decided. A large number of the suits are pending in the United States Court of the Northern District of New York, which will be quashed if the suit of the Government shall prove successful.—Derrick.

ONE of the means used last fall to bring about the triumph of Pattison and reform was the circulation of vague charges against Gen. Beaver's honesty and efficiency in the management of the State Agricultural College at Bellefonte. As if to strengthen the hints thrown out, much was made of the fact that a committee of the Legislature was investigating the management of this and the other State experimental farms. That committee has made a report, which cost the State \$7,000, and which sets forth that the Bellefonte College has been honestly and judiciously managed, and is fully meeting the purposes of its creation. It is not worth while, however, to call the attention of the Pattison-Stewart combination of slanderers to this refutation of their dirty work in the fall. That work contributed to the grand "reform" of our Commonwealth, and is, therefore, like beauty, its own excuse.—Franklin Press.

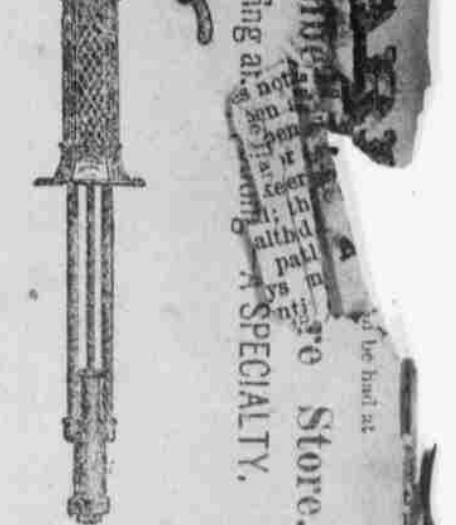
