The original Mexicans, it is said, Hved in a country north of California until about the year A. D. 1160, when they began their migration southward toward the country of Anahuac. Optical Illusions.

The fact is, we see nearly as much with our experience as we see with our eyes. That cases do happen where it is very difficult even for the experienced physician to determine whether a person is really or but apparently dead, without his having recourse to means which, while they would at once settle the dispute, would place life, if it really still existed, in jeopardy, may be judged from the fact that the French academy, some ten or fifteen years ago, offered a prize of 40,000 francs (\$8,000) for the discovery of some means by which even the inexperienced may at once de termine whether in a given case death had ensued or not. A physician obtained the prize. He had discovered the following well-known phenomenon: If the hand of the suspected person is held toward the candle or other artificial light, with the fingers stretched, and one touching the other, and one looks through the spaces between the fingers toward the light, there appears a scarlet red color where the fingers touch each other, due to the still circulating fluid blood, as it shows itself through the transparent, not yet congested tissues; but when life is extinct, this phenomenon at once ceases. The most extensive and thorough trials established the truth of this observation, and the prize was awarded to its discoverer .- Health and Home.
