A new trial has been granted L. C. Courro, for the reason that the Court erred in rejecting certain testimony on the former trial, as will be seen by the following opinion of the Court, filed April 23, 1885:

Commonwealth vs. L. C. Courro, No. 4, Dec. Sessions, 1884. Without now adverting to all the reasons alleged for a new trial, we think that the Court erred in refusing to permit the defendant's counsel to test the knowledge of the witness, P. M. Clark, of the hand writing of J. H. Dingman, by exhibiting to the witness certain papers containing the admitted signature of Dingman, and to ask him whether the signatures to such papers were in the hand writing of Dingman.

We think we were clearly in error in this ruling. It is not for us to say whether the overruling of the offer of defendant in this respect did or did not prejudice him with the jury. Having rejected evidence which defendant was entitled to have go to the jury, our duty is plain.

The rule to show cause why a new trial should not be granted is made absolute. BY THE COURT.
