#### VICE PRESIDENT HENDRICKS DEAD.

For the fifth time the country is called to mourn the death of a Vice President while holding the office. They were George Cliston, Elbridge Gerry, William R. King and Henry Wilson, Thomas A. Hendricks died at his home in Indianapolis, Indiana, on Wednesday evening, Nov. 25, 1885, at 4:45 o'clock, after an illness of about 24 hours. His physicians pronounced his disease paralysis of the

Mr. Handricks was born September 7, 1819, near Zanesville, O., and when six months old was taken by his parents to Indiana, of which state he has ever since been a resident until his death at Indianapolis, its capital, last Wednesday. The story of his life naturally divides itself into three parts. The first covers the period of his boyhood, education at Hanover College, study of the law at Chambersburg, Pa., election to the Legislature in 1848 and to Congress in 1851, defeat for re-election in 1854, appointment to be commissioner of the General Land Office in 1855 and his defeat for governor in 1860.

The War of the Rebellion brought a flood of great principles and new ideas in statesmanship, for which he was prepared neither by the bent of his mind nor by his training. The death of Vice President Hendricks will not make a lasting imon his age. No great thought or Warren county. great measure has originated with him and been woven into the woof of our destinies, and yet, when he fell, a familiar figure passed away. He was a man with many friends; warm, enthusiastic and faithful. They followed his movements with the keenest interest and every manifestation of willing service. He was possessed of exceptional social qualities; amiable affectionate, easy approached and in his intercourse with those about him carefully considerate of their feelings. For many years he was a part of the public life of the country, as a leader of his party, shaping its policy, as a part of its machinery and always active in its operations. He was an active bourbon Democratic partisan of the ante bellum school. He was sincere in his partisanship, and untiring in pushing it to the front in his life. His death will be mourned especially by those who look upon party success as the road to personal emolument and regarded him as an important integer in the forces they relied upon to shape the policy of the National Administration in accordance with their views and hopes. 
