Letter from Rev. Elliot.

The many friends of Rev. Wm. Elliott, former pastor of the Presbyterian Church here, will be pleased to hear from him, and from a letter to one of our citizens under date of March 12, at Canal-Fulton, Ohio, he says:

I am sometimes careless about writing letters, yet I never forget my friends, and am always delighted to hear from them, for, as Burns says, "I'll never forget the days of auld lang syne."

I am pleased to note your town is growing and rejoicing in the prosperity of my old friends. I hope riches will not injure them; a full cup is the harvest to hold. I am located between Cleveland and Massillon, on the Cleveland and Wheeling R. R., 50 miles south of Cleveland. Our town is not large, but thrifty, having a population of 2000. Ours is the leading Church; its seating capacity is about 400 and we have a nice new parsonage close by the church; also a large Sabbath School membership well managed; a Ladies Missionary Society that last year raised \$119. My congregation is growing steadily. The farming land in this vicinity is fine. The first settlers here were Pennsylvania Dutch and Scotch Irish, similar to Pennsylvania. We have any amount of bituminous coal, nearly every farm in this county is underlaid with it. Yet we raise the finest wheat in Ohio. I have been here about one year and a half, and on the whole I like this portion of Ohio very much; the country and the church are prospering. I was pleased to hear that you had some increase in your church last summer. I pray it may continue to grow in grace until it becomes "Fair as the morn, bright as the sun, and terrible as an army with banners." I would like to see my old friends once more, but it is hard for me to get away from home. In this section we have several small lakes that are very pleasant in hot weather and good for fishing, but game is scarce and hunting poor. Give my sincere regards to all the old friends.
