Republican Primary Election.

Pursuant to a Resolution of the members of the County Committee, passed on the 17th day of May last, it is ordered that the Republican voters of Forest County meet on

SATURDAY, JUNE 19, 1886, at 2 o'clock p. m., at the following named places of holding Primary Elections, to-wit:

- Barnett, Jacob Maze's Carpenter Shop. Jenks, Eastern precinct, at Byrom Station. Jenks, Central precinct, at Marienville. Jenks, Southern precinct, at Gilfoyle. Harmony, Upper, at Fleming School House. Harmony Lower, Allender School House. Howe, Upper, at Brookston. Howe Middle, at Gusher City. Howe, Lower, at Balltown, where the voters of upper Kingsley will vote also.

Hickory, Upper, at Braceville. Hickory, Lower, at Hotel of J. W. Ball.

Kingsley, at Newtown. Green, Upper, at Guiton School House.

Green, Lower, at Nebraska. Tionesta Township, and Borough, at the Court House.

At which time and places they will by their votes nominate:—

- One person for Congress. One person for Assembly. One person for Treasurer. One person for Surveyor. One person for Coroner. One person for Representative Delegate.

Each Election precinct will also elect one person for Member of the County Committee for the ensuing year. The Polls will remain open until 7 o'clock p. m.

Return Judges will convene at the Court House, Tionesta Borough, on the following Tuesday, June 10, at 2 o'clock p. m.

Attention is called to the Act of June, 1881, regulating Primary Elections, that the Judges and Clerks, before entering upon the discharge of their duties shall take and subscribe an oath or affirmation in the presence of each other as follows, viz:

"I do (affirm or solemnly swear) that I will as Judge, Inspector or Clerk (as the case may be) at the ensuing election impartially and faithfully perform my duties in accordance with the laws and constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and in accordance with the rules and regulations adopted by the Republican party of the County of Forest, for the government of said primary elections, meeting or caucus, to the best of my judgment and ability."

This oath or affirmation to be first administered to the Judge by an Inspector, then the Judge can qualify the other officers or administer the oath to any elector offering to vote. The above form is given for convenience and is that prescribed by the Act aforesaid.

Republican Primary Rules.

RULES GOVERNING THE REPUBLICAN PRIMARY ELECTIONS OF FOREST COUNTY.

- 1. The candidates for the several offices shall have their names announced in one or more of the county papers at least three weeks previous to the Primary Meetings stating the office, and subject to the action of the party at the said primary meetings. 2. The voters belonging to the Republican party in each township and borough, shall meet on a day to be designated by the County Committee, at the usual place of holding spring elections, at 2 o'clock P. M., and proceed to elect one person for Judge, and two persons for Clerks who

shall form a Board of Elections to receive votes and determine who are the proper persons to vote, and who shall hold the polls open until 7 o'clock P. M. After the polls are opened, the candidates announced shall be balloted for; the name of each person voting shall be written on a list at the time of voting, no person being allowed to vote more than once for the same office.

3. After the polls are closed the board shall proceed to count the votes that each candidate has received, and make out the returns accordingly, to be certified by the Judge and attested by the clerks.

4. The Judge (or one of the Clerks appointed by the Judge) of the respective election district, shall meet at the Court House, in Tionesta, on the Tuesday following the Primary Meetings at 2 o'clock P. M., having the returns and a list of voters, and the person having the highest number of votes for any office, shall be declared the nominee for the Republican party.

5. Any two or more persons having an equal number of votes for the same office, the Judges shall proceed to ballot for a choice, the person having the highest number to be the nominee.

6. The Return Judges shall be competent to reject by a majority, the returns from any district where there is evidence of fraud, either in the returns or otherwise, and shall reject them where there is evidence of three or more persons voting at the Primary Meeting who are not Republicans.

7. The Return Judges shall appoint Conferences—Representative, Senatorial and Congressional—whose acceptance of said appointment shall be a pledge to support the person who may receive the largest number of votes cast for that office.

8. The Return Judges may at any time change the mode and manner of selecting candidates as they may be instructed by the people at their primary meetings, due notice being given by the County Committee.

9. The Chairman of the County Committee shall be required to issue a call in pursuance of the action of the County Committee.

AN ACT

To regulate the holding of, and to prevent frauds in, the primary elections of the several political parties in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That from and after the passage of this act it shall be lawful and it hereby made the duties of the judges, inspectors and clerks or other officers, of the primary elections, meetings or caucuses held for the purpose of nominating candidates for state, city and county offices within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, before entering upon the discharge of their duties, severally to take and subscribe to an oath or affirmation in the presence of each other in form as follows, namely: "I (A B) do that I will as Judge, Inspector or clerk (as the case may be) at the ensuing election, impartially and faithfully perform my duties in accordance with the laws and constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and in accordance with the rules and regulations adopted by the party of the county of for the government of the said primary elections, meetings or caucuses, to the best of my judgment and ability; the oath or affirmation shall be first administered to the judge by one of the inspectors, then the judge so qualified shall administer the oath or affirmation to the inspectors and clerks, and may administer the oath to any elector offering to vote as to his qualifications to vote at such election."

Sec. 2. If any judge, inspector, clerk or other officer of a primary election as aforesaid shall presume to act in such capacity before the taking and subscribing to the oath or affirmation required by this act, he shall on conviction be fined not exceeding two hundred dollars; and if any judge, inspector, clerk or other officer, when in the discharge of his duties as such, shall willfully disregard or violate the provisions of any rule, duly made by the said party of the county for the government of the primary elections of the party, he shall on conviction be fined not exceeding two hundred dollars; and if any judge, inspector, clerk or other officer, shall be guilty of any willful fraud in the discharge of his duties, by destroying or defacing ballots, adding ballots to the poll, other than those lawfully voted, by stuffing the ballot box, by false counting, by making false returns or by any act or thing whatever, the person so offending shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined not exceeding five hundred dollars or imprisoned not exceeding one year, or both, or either, at the discretion of the court.

All acts or parts of acts of assembly inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed, except in counties or cities where special acts are in force for the same purpose: Provided, That the provisions of this act shall entail no expense to the counties or cities.
