The above form is given for convenience and is that prescribed by the Act aforesaid. And all boards will may be conducted according to Rules of the Republican party in this County, and law governing primaries.

CAN PRIMARY ELECTIONS OF FOREST COUNTY.

1. The candidates for the several offices

shall have their names announced in one or more of the county papers at least three weeks previous to the Primary Meetings stating the office, and subject to the action of the party at the said primary meetings. 2. 3. After the polls are closed the board shall proceed to count the votes that each candidate has received, and make out the returns accordingly, to be certified by the

4. The Judge [or one of the Clerks appointed by the Judgel of the respective election district, shall meet at the Court House, in Tionesta, on the Tuesday following the Primary Meetings at 2 o'clock P. M., having the returns and a list of voters, and the person having the highest number of votes for any office, shall be declared

the nominee for the Republican party. 5. Any two or more persons having ar equal number of votes for the same office, the Judges shall proceed to ballot for a choice, the person having the highest

number to be the nominee. 6. The Return Judges shall be competent to reject by a majority, the returns from any district where there is evidence of fraud, either in the returns or otherwise, and shall reject them where there is evidence of three or more persons voting at the Primary Meeting who are not Republicans,

7. The Return Judges shall appoint Conferees -- Representative, Senatorial and appointment shall be a pledge to support the person who may receive the largest number of votes east for that office.

8. The Return Judges may at any time change the mode and manner of selecting candidates as they may be instructed by the people at their primary meetings, due notice being given by the County Com-

9. The Chairmon of the County Committee shall be required to issue a call in pursuance of the action of the County Committee.

### AN ACT

To regulate the holding of, and to prevent wealth of Pennsylvania.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That from and after the passage of this act it shall be lawful and it hereby made the duties of the judges, inspectors and clerks or other officers, of the primary elections, meetings or caucus held for the purpose of nominating candidates for state, city and county offices within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania before enterior, properly the discount of the purpose of the purp offices within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, before entering upon the discharge of their duties, severally to take and
subscribe to an oath or affirmation in the
presence of each other in form as follows,
namely: "I (A B) do that I will as
judge, inspector or clerk (as the case may
be) at the ensuing election, impartially and
faithfully perform my duties, in accordance with the laws and constitution of the
commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and in
accordance with the rules and regulations
adopted by the party of the county adopted by the party of the county
of for the government of the said
primary elections, meetings or caucus, to
the best of my judgment and abilities;
the oath or affirmation shall be first administered to the judge by one of the inspectors, then the judge so qualified shall
administer the oath or affirmation to the
inspectors and clarks and may adminisin pectors and clerks, and may adminis-ter the oath to any elector offering to vote

as to his qualifications to vote at such election.

Sec. 2. If any judge, inspector, clerk or other officer of a primary election as aforesaid shall presume to act in such capacity before the taking and authorities. before the taking and subscribing to the oath or affirmation required by this act, he shall on conviction be fined not exceeding two hundred dollars; and if any judge inspector, clerk or other officer, when in the discharge of his duties as such, shall willfully disregard or violate the provis-ions of any rule, duly made by the raid

party of county for the government of the primary elections of the party, he shall on conviction be fined not exceeding two hundred dollars; and if any judge or inspector of a primary election as aforesaid shall knowingly re-

ject the vote of any person entitled to vote under the rules of the said party, or shall knowingly receive the vote of any person or persons not qualified as aforesaid, shall on conviction be fined not exceeding two hundred dollars; and if any judge, inspector, clerk or other officer of a primary election as aforesaid shall be guil-ty of any willful fraud in the discharge of his duties, by destroying or defacing ballots, adding ballots to the poll, other than those lawfully voted, by stuffing the ballot box, by false counting, by making false returns or by any act or thing whatever, the person so offending shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined not exceeding five hundred dollars or imprisoned not exceeding one year, or both, or either, at the piscretion of the court.

All acts or parts of acts of assembly in-consistent with this act are hereby repealed, except in counties or cities where special acts are in force for the same purpose: Provided, That the provisions of this act shall entail no expense to the counties or cities.
